MINUTE OF THE MEETING

On 18.10.2022 at The National Institute of Public Health - National Center for Surveillance and Control of Communicable Diseases took place the meeting between the representatives of the Institute of Virology "Stefan S. Nicolau" (IVN), partner in the H2020 project "Demonstration of intelligent decision support for pandemic crisis prediction and management within and across European borders" (acronym STAMINA), responsible for the national demonstration pilot (trial) and representatives of the National Institute of Public Health (INSP), an institution subordinate to the Ministry of Health, which carries out public health assistance, technically and methodologically coordinates the specialized activity in the field of substantiation, elaboration and implementation of strategies regarding the prevention of diseases, the control of communicable and non-communicable diseases and public health policies from the specific fields, at national level national and regional.

6 specialists were present at the meeting.

The topics addressed are included in the attached Agenda.

The final goal was to gather the opinions of Romanian specialists involved in the surveillance and control of communicable diseases through discussions on the topics presented, as well as through the questionnaires developed by the IVN team for the evaluation of the STAMINA instruments selected for testing in the national demonstration pilot (trial).

Based on the presentations, fully supported by members of the IVN team, the INSP participants formulated questions to clarify specific aspects and, following the discussions, they proceeded to complete the questionnaires drawn up by the IVN partner for each instrument subject to the trial testing, with the aim the collection of useful and competent information for an objective evaluation of them.

During the discussions, were interested in the way and form in which information is transmitted between the different instruments, the type of information that is transmitted, the possibilities of communication between the different authorities involved in the process of managing medical emergencies.
